

# **COVID-19 Initiatives Beyond Borders**

Together with our partners, Temasek Foundation supported communities in the region through the provision of medical and essential items to cope with the effects of the virus. As one community, we came together to pool resources and efforts to support healthcare institutions to provide adequate care and for communities to stay protected and mitigate risks.





# Indonesia

Masks, personal protective equipment, Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test kits, and medical equipment were distributed to the communities and hospitals in Indonesia.



# **Philippines**

More than 700 oxygen concentrators and 2 million reusable masks were provided for medical frontline workers and the community in the Philippines.



# Malaysia

Some 5,000 cube tents were distributed to all Girl Guides Association Malaysia branches in Malaysia, as well as its network of partners and relief centres to help communities stay prepared in the event of natural disasters occurring.



# India

The federal and state governments across India distributed more than 8,300 oxygen concentrators, ventilators, oximeters, and surgical masks for healthcare institutions and the community.

IN SOUTH ASIA

To increase the resilience of healthcare systems in South Asia, Temasek Foundation partnered with Singapore Health Services to design a training programme on field hospital design and pandemic response management. The programme focused on the rapid response needed during the onset of a pandemic – particularly the set-up and clinical management of community healthcare facilities, hospital infrastructure design and facilities planning.

A three-day programme was conducted online in December 2021, covering topics such as Singapore's pandemic response and management, designing and managing temporary isolation facilities, and future facility design for unknown disease outbreaks. Some 120 healthcare professionals from India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, and Nepal participated in the programme.

SERO-SURVEILLANCE STUDY ON COVID-19 VACCINES

The COVID-19 global situation has heightened the need for countries to collaborate and develop a common knowledge and understanding of the best practices that can better prepare their communities to manage future pandemics.

The programme provides a platform for scientists and clinicians from various research teams and institutes in ASEAN to exchange knowledge on diagnostics and vaccines, including discussions on herd immunity, vaccination strategies, and immunity passport concepts.
















HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME IN INDIA

The global pandemic has revealed the vulnerabilities of hospital management practices and patient safety across healthcare institutions globally.

To establish new systems and processes in the fight against infectious diseases, some 100 healthcare professionals will be trained in hospital infrastructure planning, design and flow, while senior leaders will enhance hospital management skills to improve patient care and safety in Maharashtra, India.

Healthcare authorities in Uzbekistan are striving to improve the accessibility and cost-effectiveness of their primary healthcare system for their citizens.

Part of their plans include a programme for 175 Uzbekistan healthcare leaders and specialists to study operational excellence in urban healthcare. In particular, these leaders will learn more about Singapore's multi-agency approach to developing, governing, and transforming its urban healthcare management, and managing a network of polyclinics to provide accessible primary healthcare to the community.


With digitalisation happening at an ever-accelerating pace, workers need to acquire new digital skills to cope with the fast-changing requirements of industry needs.

PROGRAMME IN
INDONESIA

In line with Indonesia's emphasis on sustainable policies and practices, some 100 public officials will participate in a programme on green economy issues, covering topics such as closing resource loops, sharing technologies and options for waste management and clean energy.

These leaders will also explore opportunities for a circular economy to support the development of a high-level green economy roadmap for Indonesia.


# Strengthening Social Resilience and Uplifting Lives
